
English:	
Phonics - revise	<p>Mr Mc Day 11 'air' words (this is a trigraph) https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OAD7tsS8vtk If you have a balloon at home there is a nice activity at the end of this lesson!</p>
Reading:	<p>Read air words on a balloon if you have one, on the ground with chalk or write 'air' words on pieces of paper or card and hide around the house/outside - can they find them and read them? Orally put them into a sentence? (air, fair, hair, stair, pair, flair, chair.) If your child says words such as wear, pear that is fantastic as they are recognising the sound but just show them that it is written a different way. You may make two lists of words. Those that are written with the air trigraph and those that are written differently?</p>
Reading:	<p>Oxford Reading Owls How are you getting on with this website? If you are able to access it please can your child choose a book they think they would like to read from the colour band they are currently on or the next one - I think some children have been doing really well learning their digraphs/trigraphs and tricky words and are ready for the next level! Please can your child tell you about what they have read? Favourite part and why? Who were the characters? How did it end? Why?</p>
Spellings:	<p>my, her, was If your child is unsure of how to write them, please write the word out for them, show them it, count to 10 then hide it behind your back, can they then write it? Show them the word again to check if they have got it right. If not, let them just copy the word by looking at it and try again later/tomorrow. This is known as Look, Cover, Write, Check. (LCWC)</p>

Maths:	
Number	<p>Number bonds to 10 by Jack Hartman (also sings one for bonds to 20) https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ID9tjBUiXs0 or I can say my number pairs 10 also by Jack Hartman (slightly more visual as he uses his hands to demonstrate) https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ch7KzI3n2Zk Can your child count to 20? If you write the numbers on paper can they order them independently? Can they say which number comes before numbers to 20 or which comes number comes after a number to 20? If they are able to order the numbers please take a photo for me. Thank you.</p>

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
